

Year
11

Students focus on personal safety and risk through learning of healthy relationships and how alcohol can negatively influence a future relationship. Students revisit key knowledge from year 10, reaffirming their learning on risk. Importantly, students consider testicular and cervical health to build their knowledge of personal safety and health.

Year
10

Students focus on personal safety and risk through understanding mental health and promoting emotional wellbeing. The themes of risk and safety are covered in different ways, including those faced as an individual and in a relationship - developed from year 9. Gambling, CSE, modern day slavery, in addition to knowledge of STIs and contraception form part of the curriculum.

Year
9

Students focus on personal safety and risk through understanding the role of the Police, crime and why justice is important. Students consider the safety of others, through their work learning of FGM - and how people can take care of each other in a relationship. Avoiding risky behaviour is a topic that builds on gang culture to include knife crime, and county lines. Drugs, addiction and online trolling are also studied.

Year
8

Students focus on personal safety and risk through considering issues that may arise in friendship groups and outside of the school, through social media and on TV. Understanding the risks of smoking/vaping, the negative influence of gang culture in creating unnecessary risk and how bullying impacts upon the wellbeing of other people.

Year
7

Students focus on personal safety and risk through considering how to build their network or trusted friends. Making good decisions inside and out of school is key to this, through the learning of 'right from wrong', and how consent keeps everybody safe and feeling cared for. Online safety is studied. Students consider potential risks that they may face and how to overcome them.
